### AWARE ACADEMY (ages 5-12)

A free program for educators centered on the impact of climate change and environmental issues on local communities. Students can easily continue their environmental voyage to the AWARE program.

### AWARE (ages 13+)

Action Within A Resilient Environment is a SeaTrust Institute youth initiative that engages students in research, education, and community action to increase environmental awareness and action through experiential learning activities.
